In 2025, we plan to upgrade court 2 with a new floor. There are quite a few dead spots on the court now and the floor will not take another sanding. We are also looking at a re skim of the walls and front wall to future proof this court for the next 10 years+.

We are currently in the process of selecting a supplier. Once selected we plan to undertake the works over the summer months.

Gillian Mead will be the tournament manager and all results will be managed in MyCourts, so you can check back on results, fixtures and deadline dates for each round.





Squash Rules Quiz - Foot Fault

When do you call a foot fault? We all know when we are marking a match that some players flout the foot fault rules; but how many times have you heard a marker call "FOOT FAULT"?

So which scenarios would you call a foot fault?

- 1. Both feet are touching the service box line when the ball is hit.
- 2. One foot is touching the floor outside of the service box and the other foot is raised but in the air in the service box area when the ball is hit
- One foot is grounded in the service box, the other is touching the service box line when the ball is hit
- 4. I would never call a foot fault as I don't want to be confrontational in a match!
